

Opting out

A student may opt out of the requirement if:

- Student is 18 years of age or older
- Parent or guardian submits a signed form
- School counselor authorizes the student to opt out






What is the FAFSA?

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid
- Required by all colleges
- Available October 1
- Complete by earliest deadline (Texas priority deadline is January 15)







FSAID



What is the FSA ID?

- Self-selected username and password
- Used to access Federal Student Aid (FSA) online systems
- Serves as legal signature
- Create at <u>studentaid.gov</u>

Create an Account (FSA ID)







Whether you're a student, parent, or borrower, you'll need to create your own account to complete federal student aid tasks.

What You Can Use Your Account For

- Filling out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form
- · Signing your Master Promissory Note (MPN)
- · Applying for repayment plans
- Completing loan counseling
- Using the Public Service Loan Forgiveness Help Tool

FSA ID Troubleshooting



- After creating her FSA ID, Khadija receives an email saying her information could not be matched with the Social Security Administration (SSA)'s records. What next steps would you recommend?
 - 1. Check that she entered all info *exactly* as it appears on her Social Security card
 - 2. Contact SSA for support



"I am a U.S. citizen"

U.S. citizens and nationals







"I am an eligible noncitizen"

- U.S. permanent residents
- Individuals with an I-94 showing: Refugee, Asylee, Cuban-Haitian Entrant, or Parolee
- Victims of human trafficking (T-Visa)
- Battered immigrants and children






"I am not a citizen or eligible noncitizen"

- Holders of nonimmigrant visas (e.g. student, work, tourist)
- Individuals with Temporary Protected Status (TPS)
- Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) recipients







TASFA Overview



What is the TASFA?

- Texas Application for State Financial Aid
- Determines eligibility for state financial aid
- Available October 1
- Texas priority deadline is January 15




Who is eligible?



- Not eligible to fill out the FAFSA
- Graduated or received a GED in Texas
- Lived in Texas 3 years prior to graduating high school or received GED
- Resided in Texas 1 year before enrolling in college
- Signed a notarized affidavit of intent to seek permanent residency when able

TASFA Completion Basics

Currently there are a few schools that have an online TASFA available



Additional Documentation

- Proof of Selective Service registration (for students assigned male at birth)
- Tax return copies and/or transcripts (parents as well if student is dependent)
- Verification of Non-Filer or statement (if taxes were not filed)
- W-2 forms
- Notarized affidavit of intent

Next Steps

TASFA

- Verify the school accepts TASFA
- Contact the Registrar's or Admissions office to confirm classification as Texas resident
- File taxes if required parents too, if dependent!
- Register with selective service (students assigned male at birth)

In which types of situations do you think a student would be independent on the FAFSA?

A student is independent if they:

Will be 24 by January 1st of award year

Are married (or separated but not divorced)

Are working on a master's or doctorate

Serve in the U.S. armed forces or are a veteran

Since age 13 - had no living parent, were in foster care, or were a ward of the court

Are an emancipated minor

Have a court-ordered legal guardian

Have children or dependents and provide more than half their support

Are an unaccompanied youth who is homeless


Students with Dependents



- Must be able to prove >50% financial support
- Examples: income from work, WIC, SNAP benefits, TANF, child support payments, etc.


Homelessness Questions



FAAs Determining Homelessness

Students must meet **both** conditions:

- Homeless = lacking fixed, regular and adequate housing
- Unaccompanied = not in physical custody of parent or guardian




Dependency: Special Circumstances





Dependency Overrides

- Documentation required
- Per college decision
- NOT guaranteed
- Good for one year


Unsubsidized Loan Only

Unsubsidized Loan Option If you do not meet a requirement for a special circumstance and still choose to continue your application without providing parent information, you will only be considered for an Unsubsidized Loan. To request consideration for an Unsubsidized Loan, you must contact the financial aid administrator at the college you plan to attend. Choose the appropriate option below based on your circumstances. I will provide information about my parent(s) I have a special circumstance and am unable to provide information about my parent(s) I do not have a special circumstance, and am submitting my FAFSA without parent information to apply for an unsubsidized loan only First-year students can qualify for \$5,500 in Direct Unsubsidized Loans




